# FROM LEARNING SUPPORT

#### PROPRIOCEPTIVE SNACKS

Proprioceptive snacks are crunchy or chewy foods that provide proprioceptive input to the brain. Proprioception is the ability to sense body movement, position, and balance.

Many of our sensory-seeking children self-regulate by chewing, biting or sucking on non-food items. Chewing on their shirt sleeve, sucking a dummy or sucking on their fingers helps to organize, calm, soothe, and regulate their sensory systems. Providing a chewy necklace or bracelet is a great way to provide input to their sensory system, but there are also certain snacks that you can provide their bodies with to help self-regulation too!

**Crunchy** snacks provide a lot of pressure input to the jaw. These snacks include: nuts, hard granola bars, apples, pears, cucumbers and carrots, bagel or pita chips, crackers, dry cereal, ice chips, pretzels and rice cakes.

**Chewy** snacks promote an increased rate of chewing as well as providing a lot of input. Some examples of these snacks are: fruit snacks, dried fruit roll, dried fruit, raisins, chewy mini bagels, gum, salami sticks and biltong.

Sucking on snacks and drinks also provides great resistance in the mouth for sensory seekers. Try these ideas:

- Drinking liquids through a crazy straw or a thick straw
- Drinking a smoothie or yogurt through a regular straw
- Sucking on yogurt squeeze pouches
- Sucking on hard mints

Moreover, this activity can be particularly beneficial in terms of giving children some power, even children with a more reserved nature are able to share an item of personal interest with excitement. Additionally, show and tell encourages self awareness and empathy. By listening to



the other children's stories, they gradually gain understanding of the surrounding world and different feelings that people can have. This week we focused on the letter "a", squares and the colour yellow. It was wonderful to witness the children thinking and working creatively!
